









## International Standard for Education (ISE) in Action: JADA led the Education Workshop with SEARADO and RADOCA

Following the successful host of the 2023 International Seminar in Asia & Oceania, the Japan Anti-Doping Agency (JADA) organised the regional Education Workshop in partnership with the Southeast Asia Regional Anti-



Doping Organization (SEARADO) and the Central Asia Regional Anti-Doping Organization (RADOCA) on 14 December 2023.

This Education Workshop was held as a follow-up to the Education Symposium held in Singapore in July 2023. This workshop also proceeded based on the presentations and workshop sessions from the International Seminar, so that the Clean Sport Education professionals can take actions in their respective countries, from Brunei, Fiji, Indonesia, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Korea, Kuwait, Maldives, Malaysia, Mongolia, Philippines, Qatar, Singapore and Turkmenistan reunited in Tokyo with ORADO, SARADO and SEARADO officials as well as WADA, Mr. Tom May (Director of NADO/RADO Relations).

During the Workshop, the participants shared the actual actions taken from July and the planned future actions in their respective countries and regions. To expand the ideas to develop educational strategy and have better idea on education objectives versus learning objectives, the members experienced the activities based on the materials from JADA's Real Champion Education Package.

Both SEARDO and RADOCA have a continuous partnership with JADA under a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). JADA and each RADO are working closely with the member countries to bring quality practices into their anti-doping programs.

Dr. YaYa Yamamoto, Director for Education, emphasized that "this workshop is the platform to share ideas what's happening in each country as well as the opportunity to learn, cooperate, and harmonize each other. We cannot achieve the global clean sport environment on our own. This collaborative approach will continue to develop effective and sustainable clean sport environment. Education is not about numbers; it is about changing behaviours, development of life-skills and values of individuals, so the long-term vision is important. Based on the Code and ISE (International Standard for Education), learning the good practice will lead us better practice by taking athletes-centered approach." SEARADO Director General, Mr. Gobi Nair, also echoed as "a step-by-step approach is important to ensure our quality practice", whilst RADOCA Director, Ms Venera Abdulla, appreciated JADA and WADA sharing with the member countries the opportunities and "bring the 'family' united to raise the bar".





With great support from Mr. Tom May from WADA, the member countries exchanged their challenges, possible solutions and actions that will be incorporated in their Education Plan and activities.

In the beginning of Education Workshop, the WADA President Witold Bańka appraised the members' commitment to education and vital effort all are taking.

JADA will continue strengthening partnerships with our clean sport community in Asia and Oceania to unite us as "PLAY TRUE Creator" for bringing the clean and fair sport into the future.
















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
