ITTF & JADA for Enhanced Partnerships on the Promotion of Clean Sport and Sport Values

The International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) and the Japan Anti-Doping Agency (JADA) met today at the occasion of the Directors Meeting held during ZEN-NOH 2014 World Team Championships in Tokyo, and agreed on further cooperation on promoting the values of sport. ITTF commemorated JADA's ongoing strong partnership in promoting the ITTF's anti-doping programme, especially in- and out-of-competition testing, and protecting the sport.

Shin Asakawa also reiterated the commitment for further partnership and cooperation: "It has been our pleasure working with ITTF and JADA is honoured and appreciated with their recognition of our partnerships. JADA has the "Play True Family" programme to develop the personnel who leads anti-doping seminar or outreach programme and some officials from the Japan Table Tennis Association are active in playing a big role in protecting sport and promoting a good value."
